I am thrilled to announce that the Global Leaders Council for Reproductive Health has selected Peru as a winner of the 2014 Resolve Award. Thank you for taking the time to submit this thoughtful nomination.

Though the Council received many strong nominations, Peru stood out for its multisectoral approach to addressing teen pregnancy, and the leadership and motivation behind the new policy. We applaud the commitment to drive change. Peru's sustained dedication to universal access to reproductive health led to the Council's selection of Peru as the Resolve Award winner in the category of Policy Development.

A member of Peru's delegation to the World Health Assembly will accept the award on Peru's behalf at a celebration on Tuesday, May 20th, 2014. This award ceremony will be the fourth annual event in the Geneva Policy Dialogue Series for Reproductive Health, a partnership between Aspen Global Health and Development's IDEA initiative and the WHO Department of Reproductive Health and Research. The goal of the series is to facilitate peer learning on country best-practices in reproductive healthcare among the delegations to the World Health Assembly, particularly those from the 49 low-income, high maternal mortality burden countries, and those from key donor countries. Further, the series aims to raise the profile of reproductive health within the health community overall.
